


Keeping things in perspective for the Foxwood Subdivision, Sections 1 – 4 : First Quarter – Nov/Dec 2016/Jan 2017

Let's Talk TRAS The case for storing trash cans out of sight

Trash happens. Most of us can't get rid of it fast enough and it accumulates faster than we expect. We can't wait to get it out to the curb!



But all of us must be responsible about storing our trash cans. Empty or full, trash cans need to be out of sight and secure until trash collection days. Here's why...

- Security: our personal information can be exploited so easily. We need to keep our trash—yes, the trash—safely stored until trash day to keep people from stealing our personal information out of the trash!
- Health & Safety: wild and feral animals can easily get into trash • cans. They break into trash cans whether they're empty or full. Squirrels can chew through the thickest plastic containers. Trash cans stored in the garage will keep raccoons, opossums, skunks, feral cats, and dogs from getting into the trash cans and scattering the garbage.
- Deed Restrictions: Our subdivision is a restricted neighborhood • which requires trash cans to be stored out of sight. To be in compliance, we need to keep our cans stored.
- Curb Appeal: any home looks more attractive without trash • cans in full view. Trash cans are not pretty.
- Good Neighbors: even if it doesn't matter to you, it matters to • your neighbors. Be a considerate neighbor and keep those trash cans out of sight and please bring them in as soon as possible after the trash is collected.

7202 It's Just a Number... or is it? House Numbers are Important

Many homes in Foxwood do not have a house number marking the residence. There are so many homes without numbers, it is difficult to identify specific addresses.

Why do I need to display my address?

Good question. Here is the best reason for being able to identify your residence:

Your Safety & Security: When you need help, first responders need to find you-FAST! Without a house number, valuable minutes are lost. It could mean the difference between life and death.

EMS, Fire Department, and Constables need an address to help them find you quickly.

Mail & Other Delivery: Regular mail delivery as well as UPS, FedEx and other delivery services need to find your home easily. Pizza needs to get to the right house!

Here are the guidelines for displaying your address:

- 1. Display the number clearly either on the house itself, painted on the curb, or posted on the mailbox or the mailbox post.
- It should be easy to read, neatly done, and 2. securely fixed.
- 3. If you rent or lease, ask your landlord to help you with this.
